



they expect to move into its new location by the end of December. I had a sneak peek tour with Jesse, and it's exciting to see the walls going up and the space designed with volunteers in mind, shelving for food products and improved operations. The former bank vault is being transformed into a cooler, capable of holding a semi-trailer load of food.

An open house will be scheduled after the first of the year, and further information will be shared as it becomes available.

Valley View serves a client base so large that if everyone gathered in one place, they would fill Cardinal Stadium, which holds over 100,000 people. The food bank provides services to over 1,700 individuals daily — an increase of over 16,000 compared to this time last year. Starting in December, Valley View will expand the hours at its Sun City location from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. It's incredible to see the high demand for assistance in providing food for families.

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to Valley View Community Food Bank. Jesse says, "Without the volunteers at Valley View, we could not accomplish everything we do." You, too, can make a difference — whether by volunteering the first Wednesday of the month, monetary donations, providing egg cartons and grocery bags, or contributing in other ways. During the Christmas season, let's keep those who are less fortunate in our prayers and remember their need for assistance. As we say, WE are Willowbrook Strong!
