



SCAMS AND FRAUDS
DO'S & DON'TS to remember when you are contacted by a Scammer or a Fraud:

- ◆ Never assume the caller ID is correct for any call you receive. Scammers can easily spoof their caller ID.
- ◆ Scammers use a variety of tactics:
 - They will give you a sense of urgency. For example, you will lose your service if you don't act now, or what they are offering is for a limited time
 - Scammers may ask you to help someone in need or a loved one
 - A scammer may offer some incentive or something of value in return for your personal information
 - Scammers impersonate government agencies. The scam may include saying your taxes are past due, or you are violating some law
 - Scammers commonly reference computer vulnerabilities. They may say things like, "your device needs new software," or "your computer has a virus."
- ◆ Scammers have two main goals; they try to persuade you to:
 - Make a payment by providing a credit card number or bank account number. Typically, these payment methods are different from your normal payment method
 - Give up a piece of information: password, PIN, date of birth, social security number, account number or a device number - like a number from your receiver, computer or telephone.
- ◆ **If you receive a suspicious call:**
 - Do not give out any information
 - Do not make any payments or give out any of your banking information
 - If you were left a voice message, don't return the call
 - Report this to the proper Agencies.

If you have doubts, contact the company you're doing business with directly. Get the company's contact information from a separate source. Don't use any number or email given from the caller.



NEW YEAR, FRESH START

I once read in a health magazine, that everyone over 60 should do mental exercises to keep their minds sharp. I have shared this concept in several places around the church because it seems to me to be such a simple and good idea anyway. The implication in the article is that the subject matter needs to be something new, something that the individual didn't already know so that it would be challenging, a stretch for the mind. The suggestion in the article was simply that if everyone over sixty took a class on a subject that was new to them, or if they would study something new, or do something like learning to play a musical instrument, that would do the trick. I won't try to list all things offered here at the church because that list of things is constantly changing but let me offer a cross section of possibilities you might want to consider as we begin 2020.

Okay, so how about learning a new language? Did you know that our church offers a Spanish class on Monday nights? This meets the "stretch the mind" requirement listed above. If not interested in that, perhaps your New Year's weight resolution, exercise resolution, or diet resolution could be addressed at the Daniel Plan class offered on Tuesday afternoons. Want to do an in depth study? How about Disciple 3, which is beginning a two year cycle of Bible Study, or my class on the Book of Revelation which will be offered soon. Perhaps a writing class on writing your life story might seem beneficial to you and loved ones. These are just a few of the opportunities offered. Again, if you are interested, check the bulletin, newsletter or e-news for times, places and details. So, New Year, Fresh Start means "give it a shot." Your brain might really appreciate the workout!



LECTIONARY—YEAR A

Last month in Advent we began Lectionary Year A, which will continue until Advent 2020 when we cycle into Year B. The Year A Gospel readings are mostly from Matthew, with some interspersed from the Gospel of John.

You might notice Matthew's emphasis on Jesus as the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. Matthew serves as the "bridge" between the Old and New Testaments. Jesus is portrayed not as a break or disruption in the story of God's work in the world, but as the fulfillment of God's word and will throughout scripture.

We begin January by looking forward in time to Judgment Day, then revert quickly to "real time" with the Magi's visit inspired by the star of Bethlehem. Next thing we know, Jesus is baptized and is calling his disciples!
