GriefShare meets each Wednesday from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the Library Lounge.

On January 6 Christians celebrate Epiphany, when the Magi came to worship baby Jesus. Epiphany, which means an appearance or manifestation, symbolizes the first recognition of the Savior by non -Jews. Because Epiphany also is a reminder that Jesus came as the light of the whole world, its symbols include light, candles and a star.

How did the wise men know — and how do we know — that Jesus is the light of the world? As preacher George Buttrick said, "It would little avail to ask how we know. That would be like asking how we know that Beethoven's 'Hymn to Joy' is joyous. If a man were to say, 'It is not joyous to me,' he would not condemn the music; he would tell only his morbidness. There is no logic to establish an axiom, for an axiom is the basis of all logic; and the soul of Jesus has axiomatic truth. Jesus is light, and there is no proof for light except light itself."

We are blessed to begin another year as United Women in Faith. Our theme for 2023 is Excite -Invite-Unite and there are exciting programs coming this year.

Our January meeting will be held on January 16 at 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall. Bring your lunch and Dorcas will be the hostess. The program will be on the work that UMCOR does and we will be preparing personal feminine hygiene kits to ship to UMCOR to use in disaster areas. The annual pledge service will be presented at the January meeting as well. Your circle chair will give further details on how we are preparing the kits.

Phoebe: A Story, by Paula Gooder [Intervarsity Press, 2018] "When the apostle Paul wrote to the church in Rome around 56 AD, he entrusted his letter to Phoebe, the deacon of the church at Cenchreae. But who was this remarkable woman?"

In this, her debut novel, biblical scholar Paula Gooder tells Phoebe's story—who she was, the life she lived, and her firstcentury faith—and in doing so opens up Paul's theology, giving a sense of the cultural and historical pressures that shaped Paul's thinking, and the faith of the early church.
