# The Oracle of Habakkuk \*

"God, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, and makes me tread upon the heights." Habakkuk 3:19

The Old Testament (also known as the First Testament) contains a short book about a wise prophet that we know little about. Chapter 3 of his book is a poem that contains, at the end, instructions for the music leader or choirmaster to use stringed instruments to accompany it. This poem was obviously intended for use in worship.

What we do know about Habakkuk is that he was a prophet during the height of Babylonian power; in other words, a difficult time for the followers of God. His oracle contains a section where the prophet is talking to God. Another section reflects on the wickedness of their oppressors and also the poem mentioned above.

The verse at the top (3:19) gives me incredible images to draw from not only the setting of Habakkuk's life, but images that help my faith and help me cope with issues in our times as well. The image of a fleeing deer escaping its predator by scampering up the side of a mountain in a way that no predator could follow is amazing. I know plenty of times in my youth, as a Boy Scout, that I would see deer and wanted to follow them but to no avail. There just isn't any following a deer that escapes so easily by going up the side of a mountain or running tirelessly through the forest. This image helps me realize that God gifts us with helps for our life that are like the *"feet of a deer"*. There are times when God leads us to avoid problems and other times when God empowers us to face them. God helps us with the wisdom to know the difference. That deer in the forest surely had all the advantages over me. It's good to know that God also grants us "tools" to help us live victoriously too.

#### Where Does Civilization Start? Quotes from anthropologist Margaret Mead

A student once asked Margaret Mead, "What is the earliest sign of civilization?" The student expected her to say a clay pot, a grinding stone, or maybe a weapon.

After pondering the question for a few moments, Mead replied, "A healed femur."

Mead explained that in the animal kingdom, the law of the jungle is the survival of the fittest. No animal survives a broken leg long enough for the bone to heal. She added that the first sign of civilization is compassion, seen in a healed femur.

A broken femur that has healed is evidence that someone has taken time to stay with the one who fell, has bound up the wound, has carried the person to safety and has tended the person through recovery. Helping someone else through difficulty is where civilization starts.

### St. Mary's Tour

One day in March several Willowbrookers went on a tour of the Surprise location of St. Mary's Food Bank. At the tour, we learned so much about the operations of the Surprise location. Their main functions are the Kids Café meal preparation, dispersing emergency food boxes, sorting food, and repacking bulk produce.

Kids Café provides over 2,000 packaged meals Monday thru Friday. After the meals are packed, they are sent to St. Mary's Phoenix location where, the following day, they are delivered throughout the state.

Emergency food distribution: Each client can receive two emergency boxes each month and seniors (60+ years) can receive an additional food box. These food boxes contain non-perishable food items and are provided by the Federal government. The food boxes are added to the perishable food items that St. Mary's distributes. By the time the perishable and non-perishable items are combined, clients receive an entire shopping cart full of food.

The tour was so interesting. Here are some fun facts we learned: With the help of volunteers, St. Mary's serve nearly 1,000 families every day. A group of 30 can sort and pack enough food to provide more than 17,000 meals.

Give a little time, and make a big difference.


