Jesse Ramirez, founder/president of Valley View Community Food Bank will be present on Sunday, November 19th to collect the turkeys before the church service.

How many will we donate in 2023?

On the first Wednesday of each month, you will find Willowbrookers at Valley View Community Food Bank volunteering their time to provide whatever help is needed. During these gatherings, you'll hear laughter, meet new people, and get to know each other better. When your shift is over, it will make your heart feel good because you are making a difference in someone's life!

When the call went out that Valley View collected grocery bags and egg cartons, Willowbrookers came through. Every month, we fill at least two 33-gallon garbage bags stuffed with grocery bags, and we've probably collected over 600 egg cartons as well. We've set up a Valley View Community Food Bank blue container in Wilson Fellowship Hall to collect these items. The need is continuous.

Salvation Army Tour

On Monday, August 28th, while delivering donations to the Salvation Army, Liz Peck, Linda Borton, & Sue Marshall were treated to a tour of The Army's Surprise location lead by Major Kathy Merritt.

Here are some of the things we learned from Major Merritt. As a result of the pandemic, some programs remained constant while other programs had to be modified. For example, the pantry/food distribution process changed. A remodel of their location made delivery and distribution of food more efficient. They adapted a drive-thru model for food distribution and purchased refrigerators and freezers to accommodate donated perishable food items.

Other old programs remain much as they did prior to the pandemic. Sunday school and worship services take place every Sunday. On Mondays & Thursday mornings, free breakfasts are open to the public. Free hot showers are available the 2nd & 4th Tuesday of each month (towels and toiletries are provided). There are also many youth programs, rental and utility assistance, and the list goes on and on.

On an ongoing basis, through the Outreach Committee, Willowbrook supports the West Valley Salvation Army's "social service" programs.



The holiday season is fast approaching and your Outreach Committee wants to give you additional information about numerous opportunities for sharing. Our "Wish List for Giving" includes many organizations we have supported in the past.

1A. Consider "adopting-a-child" this Christmas through Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree. The gifts you purchase are given to a child of an incarcerated parent. We will have the names of 30 children and the gifts they are hoping to receive. The Angel Tree organization requests that gifts given should cost approximately \$25. Drop by the Angel Tree table in Fellowship Hall where an Outreach Committee member will provide you with additional information.

1B. Consider "adopting-a-child" this Christmas through Wesley Community Center's Golden Gate Center. Golden Gate is located in Maryvale, an economically depressed area of Phoenix. Golden Gate's "adopt-a-child" program requests that Christmas gifts should be around \$40. Look for the "Golden Gate" table in Fellowship Hall where we will have the names and gift requests of these children and detailed information about this program.

2. UMOM's Halle Center is a shelter for homeless women. As in year's past, we will be collecting throw blankets and women's pajamas for Halle Center residents. Look for collection bins in Fellowship Hall marked "HALLE CENTER" beginning in November.

3. Perhaps you would love to help support the "at-risk" teens that are served by HART Pantry. Each year at the holidays, they give high school students \$25 gift cards for Target or Walmart. The students usually use the cards to purchase clothing or shoes to carry them through the rest of the school year. You can help by purchasing \$25 gift cards from Target or Walmart on your own, or you can donate any amount and Outreach will purchase the gift cards. We will have a donation basket on the HART Pantry table throughout the month for your cards or cash. If you would prefer to write a check, please make it out to the church and note in the "Memo" line that it is for HART Pantry. Area "at risk" students will be extremely grateful!

Here's hoping one or more of these opportunities to share speak to your heart, and will fit into your gift-giving plans this Christmas.

Leavey was awarded the Purple Heart and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal with a "V" device denoting heroism in combat.
