

Share stories of your walk. Enjoy refreshments. Begin the New Year with a renewal of faith and reconnect with an important step in your faith journey.



Tuesday at Two A Gathering of Men

Every Tuesday afternoon at 2 pm there is a gathering of men in the church library. We do Bible study. Not just any Bible study. We are tackling the Book of Revelation. We cover Old Testament prophecies, New Testament scriptures and the ultimate prophecy, the revelation to John on the island of Patmos, where he received the vision of the future from the risen Christ Jesus. We tie in current events from around the world. And...we eat donuts! We drink coffee! We are getting to know the names and backgrounds of other men from church.

We do an "ice breaker" each week in order to get to know other guys from church. We are learning to trust each other well enough to make prayer requests. We share concerns and joys in a prayer time designated to what's on our heart. We are learning about the Bible, about the church, about what it's like to be a Christian man. We are gleaning from the seminary training of both Pastor Gary Kennedy and Pastor Jon Ierley. Even more amazing than that is we are learning from each other. We are learning from the wisdom of others. We are learning to use our Bibles. We are learning to read footnotes in study Bibles. We are learning about commentaries. We are learning to reason and think for ourselves, and to understand that we might not all agree on particular points. We are learning that even the biblical scholars don't always agree with each other. Imagine that!

We have learned to come together as men and to learn more about God. We have learned the importance of faith. We have learned to welcome new guys each week. We have learned that each week presents something new to learn. We are learning that the Book of Revelation can be fascinating. We are learning that the Book of Revelation can be difficult to understand when reading it alone. We have learned that the Book of Revelation can be better understood when we read it together. We have learned that these other guys from church are interesting, humorous, and pretty smart.

We welcome you to join us! We invite every guy in the church to join us. Everyone there had to come for the first time at one point. You will be welcomed.

Come join us. Tuesday at two! If you don't have a Bible, we will get you one.

The Revised Common Lectionary is a three-year cycle of reading through the Bible based on the synoptic (similar) gospels of Matthew, Mark and

Luke. The years are titled A (Matthew), B (Mark) and C (Luke). The Christian liturgical year begins the first Sunday of Advent and ends on Christ the King Sunday. If you read all the lections for all three years, you will read 85% of the Bible. Come and join us on Monday mornings at 11:00 am to read the upcoming Sunday's lectionary and to talk about it. We finish at noon.
