The Stewardship of Spiritual Gifts

During the season of Lent several of the sermons preached here at Willow-

brook United Methodist Church referred to spiritual gifts. The Bible speaks of spiritual gifts. One example is First Corinthians 12:4-6. "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone."

These Bible verses or sermons about spiritual gifts cause us to reflect and ponder about our own spiritual gifts. What are they? Sometimes they are apparent to us. Sometime we just seem to know what that gift is and other times, we don't. In those cases, we try to discern what the gifts might be through a Spiritual Gifts inventory or Bible study. We can have many gifts!!

The above verse uses the words gifts, service, and activities. The work of a church requires many gifts, service, and activities and again, according to the verse above, it is "God who empowers them all in everyone." I believe "everyone" is a key word here. God empowers all of us with gifts, and the ability to use them. What part of the life of the church are you interested in? What aspect of the church brings you joy? Is it worship? Activities? Education? Could it be behind the scenes support that perks your interest? Gravitating toward your interest area might just reveal your place and purpose in the family of God. It is in using your gift or gifts that you find the greatest satisfaction in the church and your greatest joy in the Lord. What do you have to lose? Seek your place in the church and you will inevitably find your purpose. Seek your gift and you find the "Gift Giver"! Nothing to lose, everything to gain!




April is a joy-filled month of sharing together. The United Women in Faith will host a spring salad luncheon on April 15 at




Winsome Widows is a social group for widows. We get together to embrace life, meet new people, and just have fun. We get together on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month.
