I remember that going to high school brought many new changes and experiences to my life. It was with some anxiety that I rode the bus to Santa Paula Union High School. Mr. Emery was the bus driver. He was the same bus driver who drove me to school in my first days of elementary school, Such was life in a small town in California. Going to high school for our whole class of graduates from junior high school brought "stories" of what could happen to freshman. Sure, enough on the first day of school, we freshman, as we stood on "Freshman Court" were pelted with eggs by upper classman. Welcome to High School!! High school did become some of the most wonderful experiences and memories of my life, but that first day was tough. Mr. Emery drove the bus for me on my last day of high school four years later. He and I and some of the other students celebrated the ride to school that day! Mr. Emery was emotional that day as were we!

For me, the first day of going to the church youth group was equally anxiety-filled. Our church was small, and we did not have a junior high youth program. So going to high school also meant going to the youth group at El Buen Pastor United Methodist Church. All the older youth attended. Even though I knew everyone well and the youth group contained my older brother and several cousins, it was a new experience and two of us were freshman going for the first time. Why did the first day of high school have to be so traumatic? Why was the first time at youth group feeling the same? Change is difficult! The first day of something new is always hard. I must say however that the youth group, the MYF (Methodist Youth Fellowship), turned out to be like my high school experience: wonderful!

I remember, the youth group ended with a closing benediction that all the older kids had memorized, but it was new to us freshman. They all held hands and recited together by memory the words of the MYF Benediction, printed above. It ended with the phrase, "...and give you peace". That phrase then, and now, reminds me that even in new experiences God is present to give us peace, wonderful peace! Change is hard! God has been with us and will continue to be with us. ALWAYS!

- The new rotation for Sunday coffee is working well. There is a two-week rotation for the participants. Committees and groups who have not participated in the past are now in the schedule.




